

Hike to the chalet Litzlhofalm

Would you like to experience a true natural paradise? Simply hike up past the Wallackhaus and then descend into the valley along a 2000 year-old Roman path. You'll feel like you're in a fairy tale, surrounded by mountain waterfalls and rivers. At the end of the trail, you'll be welcomed at the Litzlhofalm chalet, where you can sample homemade cheese, milk, bacon, pickled vegetables, and many other delights.

- The hike to the chalet is about 7 kilometers long, but you can shorten it by parking at the Hochtor or Mittertötl tunnels.

Hike to Heiligenblut

Would you like to witness the changing nature from an altitude of 2300 down to 1300 meters above sea level? By making your way from Wallackhaus, you'll discover the charming mountain village of Heiligenblut in the valley. According to legend, the Danish prince Briccius transported a bottle containing the blood of Christ along this route, but he perished in a snowstorm. At the site of his death, a chapel was built and the bottle was kept in the church of St. Vinzenz, which dominates the village.

- From Wallackhaus, it's less than 6 kilometers to Heiligenblut, and you can hike another 5 kilometers to the Briccius chapel. [You can find the link to this route here.](#)



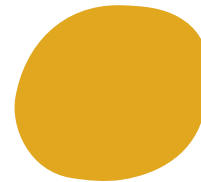
Hike to the Brennkogel mountain

When you're at Wallackhaus, how about conquering your first 3000-meter peak? The Brennkogel mountain is an impressive 3018 meters high, but there's no need to worry. The summer ascent is safe, and it's not too far, so you'll only be climbing 737 meters. Your reward will be a fantastic view of the alpine landscape, and who knows, maybe you'll even dare to climb Austria's highest mountain, Grossglockner, afterwards.

- The trail to Brennkogel is just over 5 kilometers long, and since Wallackhaus is already at 2300 meters, you'll have three quarters of the ascent behind you.

Hike to the glacial lakes

This hike is perfect for the whole family, but make sure to get up early because it gets crowded with tourists from early in the morning. The glacier lakes and mountain waterfalls are located on the Kaiser Franz Josef Höhe trail. For a longer hike, you can continue on this trail after visiting Briccius' Chapel. On the way down, you'll see Sandersee as the first lake, and then gradually pass through even more beautiful scenery until you reach Margaritzenstausee.

- The loop is just under 8 kilometers long, and along the way, you'll come across many wellhidden hydropower plants that produce clean energy. [You can find a link to the route here.](#)



Hike to Austria's highest mountain Grossglockner

If you're feeling adventurous and looking for a challenge, then hiking to the summit of Austria's highest mountain, Grossglockner, is just the thing for you. Drive from Wallackhaus to Glocknerhaus and start the almost twelve kilometer ascent to the peak of Grossglockner from there. This climb is truly demanding, so be prepared for an elevation gain of over two kilometers and make sure to inform someone about your hike beforehand or speak with the hotel manager. You can even rent an avalanche transceiver, just in case.

- Don't overestimate yourself and prepare for the 12 kilometer hike there and 12 km back, which is a full day hike. [You can find the link to the route here.](#)
